**RESOLUTION DATED MARCH 13, 2017
GLENS FALLS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT'S BOARD OF EDUCATION
SEQRA RESOLUTION REGARDING THE 2017 IMPROVEMENTS TO ALL
SCHOOLS WHICH HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AS PROJECT #1 AND PROJECT #2
(COLLECTIVELY HEREIN REFERRED TO AS "THE PROJECT").**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has reviewed the following two Projects and are ready to propose to the School District's voters the following improvements to the School District's facilities:

(A) Project 1 consists of reconstruction and alterations to the School District's High School building located at 10 Quade Street, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 302.19-14-1); to the Middle School Building located at 20 Quade Street, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 302.19-14-1); to the Kensington Road Elementary School Building located at 43 Kensington Road, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 302.15-1-6); to the Jackson Heights Elementary School Building located at 24 Jackson Avenue, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 303.9-7-28); to the Sanford Street Elementary School Building located at 10 Sanford Street, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 302.16-2-18); to the Big Cross Elementary School Building located at 15 Big Cross Street, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 309.11-8-1); to the School District's Bus Garage located at 31 Glenwood Avenue, Queensbury, New York (tax map parcel 302.7-1-56); and to the School District's Administration Building located at 15 Quade Street, Glens Falls, New York (tax map parcel 302.19-14-1). The improvements to these facilities are outlined on the attached Exhibit 1; and

(B) Project 2 consists of the construction of lighting additions to the athletic field adjacent to the High School, together with related site work. (hereinafter both Project #1 and #2 will be referred to as the "Project")

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has had an opportunity to review the Project with regard to its classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (hereinafter referred to as "SEQRA") and whether it will have any significant adverse environmental impacts;

WHEREAS, the Board is a local agency pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), as described in ECL Section 8-0101, *et. seq.*, and 6 NYCRR Part 617; and

WHEREAS, SEQRA requires that no agency may undertake, fund or approve an action until it has complied with the requirements of SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the Project's scope together with the Short Environmental Assessment, Forms which have been completed for each parcel that are part of this Project, to review the classification the Project has under SEQRA and whether it will have any significant adverse environmental impacts;

WHEREAS, the Board has provided a copy of each of the Short Environmental Assessment Forms to the New York State Education Department Bureau of Facilities Planning on March 7, 2017, as it is the one of the involved and or interested agencies with this Project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, due to the Project's size, pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c)(2) and (8), the Board hereby declares that this Project be classified as an Unlisted Action under SEQRA because although it is a replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, the expansion of the pavement at one of the facility is more than 10,000 square feet in size, and as a result it is not deemed exempt from SEQRA;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that because the Project does not meet the thresholds requirements set forth in 6 NYCRR Part 617.4(b)(3), (6) and (10), it is not required to be classified as a Type I Action; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as an Unlisted Action, it is not necessary for there to be Lead Agency acceptance by other involved or interested agencies, or a coordinated review, as is required in a Type I Action, and as a result, the Board hereby declares itself as Lead Agent for this uncoordinated review, without having to wait a 30 day period; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that because it is an Unlisted Action, only a Short Environmental Assessment Form is needed, and as a result, the Board has used the Part 1 of the Short Environmental Assessment Form (hereinafter EAF) to complete Part 2 of the Short Environmental Assessment Form; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with the Board's review of the Project, the EAF, and the Criteria for Determinating Significance as described in 6 NYCRR Part 617.7, the Board hereby finds that the Project will not have a significant impact on the environment and therefore does not require the preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Determination of Significance shall be considered a Negative Declaration made pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board is hereby authorized and directed to file any and all appropriate notices of this determination so that the intent of the Resolution is carried out.

If a voter has heretofore registered pursuant to §2014 of the Education Law and has voted at an annual or special district meeting within the last four (4) calendar years, he or she is eligible to vote at this election; if a voter is registered and eligible to vote under Article 5 of the Election Law, he or she is also eligible to vote at this election. All other persons who wish to vote must register on April 26, 2017, from 9 to 11 a.m. and 2 to 4 p.m., at the School District Office or by May 2, 2017 at the Warren County Board of Elections. The register so prepared pursuant to §2014 of the Education Law will be filed in the office of the Clerk of the School District in the Administration Building, 15 Quade Street, Glens Falls, New York, and will be open for inspection by a qualified voter of the District beginning on Monday, May 8, 2017 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., prevailing time, on weekdays, and each day prior to the day set for the election, except Saturdays and Sundays.
